Dear Dr. Brindley:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Texas Open Records Act, article 6252-17a, V.T.C.S. Your request was assigned ID# 7840; this decision is OR89-418.

Under the Open Records Act, all information held by governmental bodies is open unless the information falls within one of the act's specific exceptions to disclosure. Attorney General Opinion H-436 (1974). The act places on the custodian of records the burden of proving that records are excepted from public disclosure. If a governmental body fails to claim an exception, the exception is ordinarily waived unless the information is deemed confidential under the act. See Attorney General Opinion JM-672 (1987). The act does not require this office to raise and consider exceptions that you have not raised.

We have considered the exceptions you claimed and reviewed the documents at issue. Your request for an open records decision falls within a previous determination of this office, Open Records Decision No. 412 (1984), a copy of which is enclosed. For this reason, you may withhold the requested information.

Because case law and prior published open records decisions resolve your request, we are resolving this matter
