
Dear Mr. Linér:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Texas Open Records Act, chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request is assigned ID# 25823.

The Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board (the "board") has received a request for information relating to the number of times a particular individual has taken the licensure exam. The board states that the requested information is protected from disclosure under sections 552.101 of the Government Code. Section 552.101 protects "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." The Texas Appraiser and Certification Act provides that: "[t]he results of the examination are confidential." V.T.C.S. art. 6573a.2. Therefore, all information which would reveal such information is confidential under article 6573a.2.

Because case law and prior published open records decisions resolve your request, we are concluding this matter with an informal letter ruling rather than with a published open records decision. If you have questions about this ruling, please contact our office.
