Dear Ms. Brown:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 344031.

The Plano Police Department (the "department") received a request for the police report, including arrest information and any supplements, for a specified incident at a specified address. You state you have referred the requestor to the Plano Municipal Court Clerk for a portion of the requested information. You state the department is withholding all but "front page information" from the requested responsive incident report based upon the ruling in *Attorney General v. Plano Police Department*, No. GV-001919 (126th Dist. Ct., Travis County, Tex., December 18, 2000) (stating the department may withhold an offense report related to a pending criminal case under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code without seeking a decision from this office). You state you will release the basic "front page information" to the requestor. See Gov't Code § 552.108(c) (stating basic information about arrested person, arrest, or crime may not be withheld under section 552.108); Open Records Decision No. 127 (1976) (summarizing types of information considered to be basic information). You claim the remaining submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.108 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

We note the submitted information includes search warrants that have been filed with a court. Section 552.022 of the Government Code provides in relevant part:

(a) Without limiting the amount or kind of information that is public information under this chapter, the following categories of information are

public information and not excepted from required disclosure under this chapter unless they are expressly confidential under other law:

(17) information that is also contained in the public court record[.]

Gov't Code § 552.022(a)(17). Section 552.022(a)(17) makes information filed with a court expressly public unless it contains information that is expressly confidential under other law. You claim this information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.108 of the Government Code. However, section 552.108 is a discretionary exception that protects a governmental body's interests and is, therefore, not "other law" for purposes of section 552.022(a)(17). Open Records Decision Nos. 665 at 2 n.5 (2000) (discretionary exceptions generally), 586 (1991) (governmental body may waive section 552.108). Therefore, the department may not withhold the court-filed documents, which we have marked, under section 552.108 of the Government Code. As you have raised no further exceptions to the disclosure of this information, it must be released.

You claim the information not subject to section 552.022 is subject to section 552.108 of the Government Code. Section 552.108 provides in part:

(a) Information held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime is excepted from [required public disclosure] if:

(1) release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation or prosecution of crime; [or]

(2) it is information that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime only in relation to an investigation that did not result in conviction or deferred adjudication[.]

Gov't Code § 552.108(a)(1)-(2). You appear to raise both of these provisions, which generally are applicable to mutually exclusive types of information. Section 552.108(a)(1) is applicable to information whose release would interfere with a pending criminal investigation or prosecution. Section 552.108(a)(2) is applicable only to information relating to a concluded criminal investigation that did not result in a conviction or a deferred adjudication. A governmental body must reasonably explain how and why section 552.108 is applicable to the information at issue. *See id.* § 552.301(e)(1)(A); *Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1977).

You state the information at issue relates to an active and open case that is still pending. You also state the release of this information would interfere with the investigation and


prosecution of this crime. Based on your representations and our review of the information at issue, we conclude section 552.108(a)(1) is applicable to the information at issue. *See Houston Chronicle Publ'g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. Civ. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975), *writ ref'd n.r.e.*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976) (per curiam) (court delineates law enforcement interests that are present in active cases). Accordingly, the department may withhold the remaining submitted information not subject to section 552.022 under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code.

In summary, the department must release the search warrants pursuant to section 552.022(a)(17). The department may withhold the remaining submitted information under section 552.108(a)(1).

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
