Dear Ms. Sandoval-Walker:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 341528.

The El Paso Police Department (the "department") received a request for any records or reports pertaining to a named individual. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses information that other statutes make confidential, such as section 58.007 of the Family Code. Juvenile law enforcement records relating to conduct that occurred on or after September 1, 1997 are confidential under section 58.007(c). For purposes of section 58.007, "child" means a person who is ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age. *See* Fam. Code § 51.02(2). Section 58.007 provides in relevant part:

(c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), law enforcement records and files concerning a child and information stored, by electronic means or otherwise, concerning the child from which a record or file could be generated may not be disclosed to the public and shall be:

- (1) if maintained on paper or microfilm, kept separate from adult files and records;
- (2) if maintained electronically in the same computer system as records or files relating to adults, be accessible under controls that are separate and distinct from controls to access electronic data concerning adults; and
- (3) maintained on a local basis only and not sent to a central state or federal depository, except as provided by Subchapter B, D, and E.

Fam. Code § 58.007(c). In order for section 58.007(c) to apply, a child must be identified in the information at issue as a suspect or offender. *See id.* § 51.02(2) (defining “child” as a person who is ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct). Section 58.007(c) is not applicable to information that relates to a juvenile as a complainant, victim, witness, or other involved party. Upon review of the submitted information, we find most of the submitted information involves juvenile delinquent conduct and juveniles engaged in conduct in need of supervision that occurred after September 1, 1997. *See id.* § 51.03(b) (defining “conduct indicating a need for supervision” to include “the voluntary absence of a child from the child’s home without the consent of the child’s parent or guardian for a substantial length of time or without intent to return”). However, report number 06-221116 does not identify a juvenile suspect or offender engaged in delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision for purposes of this section. Therefore, we conclude you have failed to establish section 58.007(c) is applicable to report number 06-221116, and it may not be withheld under this section. The other submitted reports are confidential under section 58.007.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code also encompasses section 261.201(a) of the Family Code, which provides in relevant part:

(a) The following information is confidential, is not subject to public release under Chapter 552, Government Code, and may be disclosed only for purposes consistent with this code and applicable federal or state law or under rules adopted by an investigating agency:

- (1) a report of alleged or suspected abuse or neglect made under this chapter and the identity of the person making the report; and
- (2) except as otherwise provided in this section, the files, reports, records, communications, audiotapes, videotapes, and working papers used or developed in an investigation under this chapter or in providing services as a result of an investigation.

¹As our ruling is dispositive, we need not address your remaining argument for this information.


Fam. Code § 261.201(a). You claim report number 06-221116 is subject to section 261.201(a). *See id.* § 261.001(1)(C) (definition of child abuse includes “physical injury that results in substantial harm to the child, or the genuine threat of substantial harm from physical injury to the child”); *see also id.* § 101.003(a) (defining “child” for purposes of this section as person under 18 years of age who is not and has not been married or who has not had the disabilities of minority removed for general purposes). Based on our review, we find report number 06-221116 is within the scope of section 261.201 of the Family Code. You have not indicated the department has adopted a rule that governs the release of this type of information; therefore, we assume no such regulation exists. Given that assumption, the department must withhold report number 06-221116 under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code.

In summary, the department must withhold all but report number 06-221116 under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.007(c) of the Family Code. Report number 06-221116 must be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201 of the Family Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
