Dear Mr. Taylor:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 356468 (Waco Reference # LGL-09-729).

The Waco Police Department (the "department") received a request for specified police reports and CAD reports pertaining to a specified address for a specified time period. You state that the department will make some of the requested information available to the requestor. You claim that portions of the submitted information are excepted from disclosure under sections 552.108 and 552.130 of the Government Code. We also understand you to claim that a portion of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision," and encompasses information made confidential by other statutes. Gov't Code § 552.101. You have marked a telephone numbers and addresses in the submitted CAD records that you seek to withhold under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. Chapter 772 of the Health and Safety Code relates to local emergency communications districts. Section 772.318 applies to an emergency 9-1-1 district established in accordance with chapter 772, and makes confidential the originating telephone numbers and addresses of 9-1-1 callers that are furnished by a service supplier. *See Open Records*

Decision No. 649 (1996). We understand the City of Waco to be part of an emergency communication district that was established under section 772.318.¹ Provided that the information you have marked consists of originating telephone numbers and addresses furnished by a 9-1-1 service supplier, we agree that the department must withhold the marked telephone numbers and addresses in the submitted CAD records under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code.

Next, you claim that the remaining information you have marked is excepted from disclosure under section 552.108 of the Government Code. Section 552.108(a)(1) excepts from disclosure “[i]nformation held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime . . . if . . . release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime.” Gov’t Code § 552.108(a)(1). A governmental body claiming section 552.108(a)(1) must reasonably explain how and why the release of the requested information would interfere with law enforcement. *See id.* §§ 552.108(a)(1), .301(e)(1)(A); *see also Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1977). You state that the marked information relates to pending criminal cases. Based on this representation and our review of the information at issue, we conclude that section 552.108(a)(1) is applicable to the marked information. *See Houston Chronicle Publ’g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. Civ. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975), *writ ref’d n.r.e. per curiam*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976) (court delineates law enforcement interests that are present in active cases).

We note, and you acknowledge, that section 552.108 does not except from disclosure basic information about an arrested person, an arrest, or a crime. Gov’t Code § 552.108(c). Basic information refers to the information held to be public in *Houston Chronicle*, but does not include driver’s license numbers.² *See* 531 S.W.2d 186-7; *see also* Open Records Decision No. 127 (1976) (summarizing types of information made public by *Houston Chronicle*). We note that some of the information you have marked under section 552.108, including the property involved, constitutes basic information for purposes of *Houston Chronicle*. *See* 531 S.W.2d 186-7; ORD 127 at 3-4. Thus, with the exception of the basic information, which must be released, the department may withhold the information you have marked under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code.³

In summary, provided that the information you have marked consists of originating telephone numbers and addresses furnished by a 9-1-1 service supplier, the department must withhold

²We note basic information includes an arrestee’s social security number. Section 552.147(b) of the Government Code authorizes a governmental body to redact a living person’s social security number from public release without the necessity of requesting a decision from this office under the Act.

³As our ruling is dispositive, we need not address your remaining argument against disclosure.

the marked telephone numbers and addresses in the submitted CAD records under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. With the exception of basic information, which must be released, the department may withhold the information you have marked under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code. The remaining information must be released to the requestor.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
