Dear Ms. Armstrong:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 371527 (ORR 2009-11292).

The Dallas Police Department (the "department") received a request for 55 specified police reports. You state the department has released all but three of the requested reports. You claim that some of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under sections 552.101, 552.108, and 552.130 of the Government Code. We have considered the exceptions you claim and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.¹

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from public disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses other statutes that make information confidential, such as section 58.007 of the Family Code. Juvenile law enforcement records relating to conduct that occurred on or after September 1, 1997, are confidential under section 58.007, which provides in pertinent part as follows:

(c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), law enforcement records and files concerning a child and information stored, by electronic means or otherwise,

concerning the child from which a record or file could be generated may not be disclosed to the public and shall be:

- (1) if maintained on paper or microfilm, kept separate from adult files and records;
- (2) if maintained electronically in the same computer system as records or files relating to adults, be accessible under controls that are separate and distinct from controls to access electronic data concerning adults; and
- (3) maintained on a local basis only and not sent to a central state or federal depository, except as provided by Subchapters B, D, and E.

Fam. Code § 58.007(c). You claim that service number 0330739-W is confidential under section 58.007(c). Upon review, we agree that service number 0330739-W pertains to juvenile delinquent conduct, so as to fall within the scope of section 58.007(c). *See id.* § 51.03(a) (defining “delinquent conduct” for purposes of title 3 of the Family Code); *see also id.* § 51.02(2) (defining “child” as a person who is ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct). Thus, service number 0330739-W is confidential and must be withheld in its entirety under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.007(c) of the Family Code.²

Section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code excepts from disclosure “[i]nformation held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime . . . if . . . release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime[.]” Gov’t Code § 552.108(a)(1). A governmental body claiming section 552.108 must reasonably explain how and why the release of the requested information would interfere with law enforcement. *See id.* §§ 552.108(a)(1), .301(e)(1)(A); *see also Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1977). You state the information you have marked relates to pending criminal investigations and prosecutions. Based on this representation and our review, we conclude that release of the marked information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime. *See Houston Chronicle Publ’g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975), *writ ref’d n.r.e.*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976) (court delineates law enforcement interests that are present in active cases). Thus, the department may withhold the information you have marked under section 552.108(a)(1).

Section 552.130 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure “information [that] relates to . . . a motor vehicle title or registration issued by an agency of this state[.]” Gov’t Code

§ 552.130(a)(2). Therefore, the department must withhold the information you have marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code.³

In summary, (1) the department must withhold service number 0330739-W under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 58.007(c) of the Family Code; (2) the department may withhold the information you have marked under section 552.108(a)(1) of the Government Code; and (3) the department must withhold the information you have marked under section 552.130 of the Government Code. The remaining information must be released to the requestor.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
