Dear Ms. Webster:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 372096 (City Reference No. LGL-09-1317):

The Waco Police Department (the "department") received a request for all calls to two specified addresses in the past six months. You state you have released some of the requested information. You claim that portions of the submitted information are excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.


Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. You contend that the information you have marked in the submitted CAD sheets is excepted under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. Chapter 772 of the Health and Safety Code relates to local emergency communications districts. Section 772.318 applies to an emergency 9-1-1 district established in accordance with chapter 772, and makes confidential the originating telephone numbers and addresses of 9-1-1 callers that are furnished by a service supplier. *See* Open Records Decision No. 649 (1996). We understand the City of Waco (the "city") to be part of an emergency

communication district that was established under section 772.318.¹ You have marked telephone numbers that the department seeks to withhold under section 772.318. We have marked what appears to be 9-1-1 callers' originating addresses. Thus, we find that to the extent the telephone numbers you have marked, as well as the additional information we have marked, are the originating telephone numbers and addresses supplied by a 9-1-1 service supplier, this information must be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. However, to the extent any of the marked information was not supplied by a 9-1-1 service supplier, section 772.318 is not applicable to this information and it must be released to the requestor, along with the remaining information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
