Dear Ms. Gambini:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 384380.

The City of Irving (the "city") received a request for all city records on all registered dogs at a specified residence. You claim that a portion of the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This exception encompasses information made confidential by other statutes. Section 826.0311 of the Health and Safety Code, in relevant part, states the following:

(a) Information that is contained in a municipal or county registry of dogs and cats under Section 826.031 that identifies or tends to identify the owner or an address, telephone number, or other personally identifying information of the owner of the registered dog or cat is confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. The information contained in the registry may not include the social security number or the driver's license number of the owner of the registered animal.

(b) The information may be disclosed only to a governmental entity or a person, that under a contract with a governmental entity, provides animal control services or animal registration services for the governmental entity for purposes related to the protection of public health and safety. A

governmental entity or person that receives the information must maintain the confidentiality of the information, may not disclose the information under Chapter 552, Government Code, and may not use the information for a purpose that does not directly relate to the protection of public health and safety.

Health & Safety Code § 826.0311(a), (b). You state that the city contracts with PetData, Inc. to carry out the city's pet registration and licensing functions. You further state that the submitted information consists of a printout from the PetData database, and that PetData compiles the information obtained from a rabies vaccination certificate and consequently includes the type of information that tends to identify the owner of an animal. Based upon your representations and our review, we find that the submitted information consists of information from the city's pet registration list. We agree that section 826.0311 is applicable to the information you have highlighted in yellow that identifies or tends to identify the owners of registered dogs or cats. The requestor in this instance is not a governmental entity requesting the information for public health and safety purposes. Therefore, you must withhold this identifying information, which you have highlighted in yellow, under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 826.0311(a) of the Health and Safety Code.¹

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
