Dear Ms. Villarreal:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 385139 (Waco Reference # LGL-10-540).

The Waco Police Department (the "department") received a request for information pertaining to all incidents at a specified address from January 1992 to April 2010. You state you have released a portion of the requested information. You claim that portions of the submitted information are excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.


Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision," and encompasses information made confidential by other statutes. Gov't Code § 552.101. You have marked telephone numbers and addresses in the submitted information that you seek to withhold under section 552.101 in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. Chapter 772 of the Health and Safety Code relates to local emergency communications districts. Section 772.318 applies to an emergency 9-1-1 district established in accordance with chapter 772, and makes confidential the originating telephone numbers and addresses of 9-1-1 callers that are furnished by a service supplier. *See* Open Records Decision No. 649 (1996). You state that the City of Waco is part of an emergency

communication district that was established under section 772.318.<sup>1</sup> Provided that the telephone numbers and addresses you have marked consist of originating telephone numbers and addresses furnished by a 9-1-1 service supplier, we agree that the department must withhold the telephone numbers and addresses you have marked, and the additional information we have marked, under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 772.318 of the Health and Safety Code. The remaining information must be released to the requestor.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
