Dear Mr. Hawk:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 395743 (ORR No. 2010-6785).

The Dallas Police Department (the "department") received a request for information relating to a specified service number. You claim that some of the requested information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.108 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the information you submitted.<sup>1</sup>

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision."<sup>2</sup> Gov't Code § 552.101. This exception encompasses information other statutes make confidential. Section 261.201 of the Family Code provides in part:

(a) [T]he following information is confidential, is not subject to public release under [the Act] and may be disclosed only for purposes consistent with this code and applicable federal or state law or under rules adopted by an investigating agency:

(1) a report of alleged or suspected abuse or neglect made under this chapter and the identity of the person making the report; and

(2) except as otherwise provided in this section, the files, reports, records, communications, audiotapes, videotapes, and working papers used or developed in an investigation under this chapter or in providing services as a result of an investigation.

(k) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), an investigating agency, other than the [Texas Department of Family and Protective Services] or the Texas Youth Commission, on request, shall provide to the parent, managing conservator, or other legal representative of a child who is the subject of reported abuse or neglect, or to the child if the child is at least 18 years of age, information concerning the reported abuse or neglect that would otherwise be confidential under this section. The investigating agency shall withhold information under this subsection if the parent, managing conservator, or other legal representative of the child requesting the information is alleged to have committed the abuse or neglect.

(l) Before a child or a parent, managing conservator, or other legal representative of a child may inspect or copy a record or file concerning the child under Subsection (k), the custodian of the record or file must redact:

(1) any personally identifiable information about a victim or witness under 18 years of age unless that victim or witness is:

(A) the child who is the subject of the report;  
or

(B) another child of the parent, managing conservator, or other legal representative requesting the information;

- (2) any information that is excepted from required disclosure under [the Act], or other law; and
- (3) the identity of the person who made the report.

Fam. Code § 261.201(a), (k)-(l). We find that the submitted information was used or developed in an investigation of alleged child abuse under chapter 261 of the Family Code and is therefore generally confidential under section 261.201(a). *See id.* § 261.001(1) (defining “abuse” for purposes of Fam. Code ch. 261). In this instance, however, the requestor is a parent of the child who was the victim of the alleged abuse. Moreover, the requestor is not accused of committing the alleged abuse. Therefore, the department may not withhold the submitted information from this requestor on the basis of section 261.201(a). *See id.* § 261.201(k). Section 261.201(l) provides, however, that the identity of the reporting party must be withheld. *See id.* § 261.201(l)(3). We have marked the type of information that identifies the reporting party and must be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201(l)(3).

Section 261.201(l) also provides that any information excepted from disclosure under the Act or other law may be withheld. *See id.* § 261.201(l)(2). Therefore, we will address your claim under section 552.108 of the Government Code. Section 552.108(a)(1) excepts from disclosure “[i]nformation held by a law enforcement agency or prosecutor that deals with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime . . . if . . . release of the information would interfere with the detection, investigation, or prosecution of crime[.]” Gov’t Code § 552.108(a)(1). A governmental body must reasonably explain how and why section 552.108 is applicable to the information at issue. *See id.* § 552.301(e)(1)(A); *Ex parte Pruitt*, 551 S.W.2d 706 (Tex. 1977). You have marked the information the department seeks to withhold under section 552.108. You state that release of the marked information would interfere with a pending criminal case or cases. Based on your representations, we conclude that section 552.108(a)(1) is generally applicable to the marked information. *See Houston Chronicle Publ’g Co. v. City of Houston*, 531 S.W.2d 177 (Tex. Civ. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 1975), *writ ref’d n.r.e. per curiam*, 536 S.W.2d 559 (Tex. 1976) (court delineates law enforcement interests that are present in active cases).


We note that section 552.108 does not except from disclosure “basic information about an arrested person, an arrest, or a crime.” Gov’t Code § 552.108(c). Section 552.108(c) refers to the basic front-page information held to be public in *Houston Chronicle*. *See* 531 S.W.2d at 186-88; Open Records Decision No. 127 (1976) (summarizing types of information deemed public by *Houston Chronicle*). The department must release basic offense and arrest information, including a detailed description of the offense, even if the information does not literally appear on the front page of an offense or arrest report. The rest of the information you have marked may be withheld under section 552.108(a)(1).

In summary: (1) the type of information we have marked that identifies the reporting party must be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 261.201(1)(3) of the Family Code; and (2) the information you have marked under section 552.108 of the Government Code may be withheld under section 552.108(a)(1), except for the basic information that must be released under section 552.108(c). The rest of the submitted information must also be released.<sup>3</sup>

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor. 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<sup>3</sup>Although this requestor has a right of access to information relating to her child under section 261.201(k) of the Family Code, the department would ordinarily be required to withhold the submitted information under section 261.201(a). Should the department receive another request for this same information from a different requestor, the department should resubmit this information and request another decision. See Gov't Code §§ 552.301(a), .302.
