Dear Ms. Kretz:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 489851 (ORR# W024772).

The Fort Worth Police Department (the "department") received a request for incident report number 13-25326. You state the department has redacted motor vehicle record information as permitted by section 552.130(c) of the Government Code and a social security number under section 552.147 of the Government Code.¹ You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses information protected by other statutes. Juvenile law enforcement records relating to conduct that occurred on or after September 1, 1997 are confidential under section 58.007(c) of the Family Code, which reads as follows:

¹Section 552.130(c) authorizes a governmental body to redact, without the necessity of requesting a decision from this office, the motor vehicle record information described in subsections 552.130(a)(1) and (a)(3). *See* Gov't Code § 552.130(c); *see also id.* § 552.130(d)-(e) (requestor may appeal governmental body's decision to withhold information under section 552.130(c) to attorney general, and a governmental body withhold information pursuant to section 552.130(c) must provide certain notice to requestor). Section 552.147 of the Government Code authorizes a governmental body to redact a living person's social security number from public release without the necessity of requesting a decision from this office under the Act. *Id.* § 552.147(b).

(c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), law enforcement records and files concerning a child and information stored, by electronic means or otherwise, concerning the child from which a record or file could be generated may not be disclosed to the public and shall be:

- (1) if maintained on paper or microfilm, kept separate from adult files and records;
- (2) if maintained electronically in the same computer system as records or files relating to adults, be accessible under controls that are separate and distinct from controls to access electronic data concerning adults; and
- (3) maintained on a local basis only and not sent to a central state or federal depository, except as provided by Subchapters B, D, and E.

Fam. Code § 58.007(c). For purposes of section 58.007(c), “child” means a person who is ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the reported conduct. *See id.* § 51.02(2). The submitted information involves delinquent conduct that occurred after September 1, 1997. *See id.* § 51.03 (defining “delinquent conduct” for purposes of Fam. Code § 58.007). It does not appear any of the exceptions in section 58.007 apply. However, we are unable to determine the age of some of the listed suspects. Therefore, we must rule conditionally. To the extent the submitted information constitutes records of a juvenile engaged in delinquent conduct who was ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct, the submitted information is confidential pursuant to section 58.007(c) of the Family Code and must be withheld under section 552.101 of the Government Code. However, to the extent the submitted information pertains to offenders who were not ten years of age or older and under seventeen years of age at the time of the conduct, the submitted information is not confidential pursuant to section 58.007(c) and may not be withheld under section 552.101 on that basis. In that instance, the submitted information must be released to this requestor.²

²We note the information being released in this instance includes information that may be confidential with respect to the general public. *See* Gov’t Code § 552.023(a) (governmental body may not deny access to person to whom information relates or person’s agent on ground that information is considered confidential by privacy principles); Open Records Decision No. 481 at 4 (1987) (privacy theories not implicated when individuals request information concerning themselves). We also note the information being released contains the requestor’s e-mail address, to which the requestor has a right of access pursuant to section 552.137(b) of the Government Code. *See* Gov’t Code § 552.137(b). Open Records Decision No. 684 (2009) authorizes the department to withhold the requestor’s e-mail address under section 552.137 of the Government Code without the necessity of requesting an attorney general decision. Therefore, if the department receives another request for this information from a different requestor, the department must again seek a ruling from this office. *See* ORD 684.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
