Dear Mr. Bray:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 490660 (DSHS OR File: 21477/2013).

The Texas Department of State Health Services (the "department") received a request for "all 'death of a person served' worksheets for patient deaths at all psychiatric hospitals in 2012." You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from public disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. Section 552.101 encompasses information other statutes make confidential, such as section 576.005 of the Health and Safety Code, which provides, "[r]ecords of a mental health facility that directly or indirectly identify a present, former, or proposed patient are confidential unless disclosure is permitted by other state law." Health & Safety Code § 576.005. You contend the submitted information consists of records of mental health facilities that directly identify former patients. Upon review, we find the confidentiality provision of section 576.005 applies to the submitted information. You state no other state law would permit disclosure of this information in this instance. Accordingly,

the department must withhold the submitted information under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with section 576.005 of the Health and Safety Code.<sup>1</sup>

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
