Dear Ms. Hernandez:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 513195 (COSA File No. W020395).

The City of San Antonio (the "city") received a request for information regarding a specified dog identification number. You state the city has released some information to the requestor. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.101 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.101 of the Government Code excepts from disclosure "information considered to be confidential by law, either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Gov't Code § 552.101. This section encompasses information protected by other statutes, such as section 801.353 of the Occupations Code. This section provides in relevant part the following:

- (a) A veterinarian may not violate the confidential relationship between the veterinarian and the veterinarian's client.
- (b) A veterinarian may not be required to release information concerning the veterinarian's care of an animal, except on the veterinarian's receipt of:
  - (1) a written authorization or other form of waiver executed by the client; or

(2) an appropriate court order or subpoena.

Occ. Code § 801.353(a), (b). Section 801.353 limits a veterinarian's release of information concerning the veterinarian's care of an animal to certain circumstances. *See id.* You state the submitted information consists of veterinary records created by city veterinary staff for animals the city's Animal Care Services department (the "department") took from the community. You state the department is both owner and caretaker of the animals it takes in from the community. You state the city does not consent to the release of the submitted information. *See id.* § 801.351(a)(1) (defining "client" as "owner or other caretaker of the animal"). Finally, you state the requestor has not produced an appropriate court order or subpoena to release the information at issue. Based on your arguments and our review, we conclude this information consists of veterinary records that are subject to chapter 801 of the Occupations Code. Accordingly, the city may only release the submitted information in accordance with section 801.353 of the Occupations Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
