Dear Mr Meitler:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 531615 (TEA PIR# 22095).

The Texas Education Agency (the "agency") received a request for all correspondence, including electronic correspondence such as e-mail, between the agency and Accelerated Intermediate Academy for the past three years. You state a portion of the responsive information, including final audit reports, will be released to the requestor. You further state the agency has redacted some information from the submitted documents pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), section 1232g of title 20 of the United States Code.¹ You claim the remaining requested information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.116 of the Government Code. We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted representative sample of information.²

Section 552.116 of the Government Code provides,

² We assume the representative sample of records submitted to this office is truly representative of the requested records as a whole. *See* Open Records Decision Nos. 499 (1988), 497 (1988). This open records letter does not reach, and therefore does not authorize the withholding of, any other requested records to the extent that those records contain substantially different types of information than that submitted to this office.

(a) An audit working paper of an audit of the state auditor or the auditor of a state agency, an institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, a county, a municipality, a school district, a hospital district, or a joint board operating under Section 22.074, Transportation Code, including any audit relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, is excepted from [required public disclosure]. If information in an audit working paper is also maintained in another record, that other record is not excepted from [public disclosure] by this section.

(b) In this section:

(1) "Audit" means an audit authorized or required by a statute of this state or the United States, the charter or an ordinance of a municipality, an order of the commissioners court of a county, the bylaws adopted by or other action of the governing board of a hospital district, a resolution or other action of a board of trustees of a school district, including an audit by the district relating to the criminal history background check of a public school employee, or a resolution or other action of a joint board described by Subsection (a) and includes an investigation.

(2) "Audit working paper" includes all information, documentary or otherwise, prepared or maintained in conducting an audit or preparing an audit report, including:

(A) intra-agency and interagency communications; and

(B) drafts of the audit report or portions of those drafts.


Gov't Code § 552.116. You assert the information at issue consists of audit working papers pertaining to a formal audit conducted by the agency's Division of Financial Compliance in conjunction with audits of Accelerated Intermediate Academy and audit working papers prepared or maintained by the agency's Student Assessment Division Security Task Force. You state the audits are authorized by section 39.057(a)(4) of the Education Code, which permits special accreditation investigations to be conducted in response to established compliance reviews of a school district's financial accounting practices and state and federal program requirement and by section 39.057(a)(8) of the Education Code, which permits the Commissioner of Education to authorize special accreditation investigations to be conducted in response to an allegation regarding or an analysis using a statistical method result indicating a possible violation of an assessment instrument security procedure. *See* Educ. Code § 39.057 (listing circumstances in which the Commissioner shall authorize investigations). Based on your representations and our review, we agree the information at

issue constitutes audit working papers. Therefore, the agency may withhold the information at issue under section 552.116 of the Government Code.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.
