Dear Ms. Kostbar:

You ask whether certain information is subject to required public disclosure under the Public Information Act (the "Act"), chapter 552 of the Government Code. Your request was assigned ID# 534455 (HCAD ref. no. 14-2444).

The Harris County Appraisal District (the "district") received a request for the iFile number for a specified account. You claim the submitted information is excepted from disclosure under section 552.136 of the Government Code.<sup>1</sup> We have considered the exception you claim and reviewed the submitted information.

Section 552.136 of the Government Code states "Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a credit card, debit card, charge card, or access device number that is collected, assembled, or maintained by or for a governmental body is confidential." Gov't Code § 552.136(b). Section 552.136(a) defines "access device" as "a card, plate, code, account number, personal identification number, electronic serial number, mobile identification number, or other telecommunications service, equipment, or instrument identifier or means of account access that alone or in conjunction with another access device

Nonetheless, section 552.136 of the Government Code is a mandatory exception that can provide a compelling reason to overcome the presumption of openness caused by a failure to comply with section 552.301. See *id.* §§ 552.007, .302. Thus, we will consider the district's claim.

may be used to . . . obtain money, goods, services, or another thing of value [or] initiate a transfer of funds other than a transfer originated solely by paper instrument.” *Id.* § 552.136(a). You represent the information you have marked is an iFile number that can be used to access confidential property information that is valuable to property owners and third party professionals involved in the protests of property tax appraisals. Based on your representations and our review, we agree iFile numbers are access device numbers for purposes of section 552.136(a). Accordingly, the district must generally withhold the submitted iFile number under section 552.136(b) of the Government Code.

We note section 552.136 protects personal privacy. In this instance, the requestor may be the owner of the access device number at issue. The owner of an access device number has a right of access to her own access device number under section 552.023 of the Government Code, and it may not be withheld under section 552.136. *See id.* § 552.023(a) (governmental body may not deny access to person to whom information relates or person’s agent on ground that information is considered confidential by privacy principles); Open Records Decision No. 481 at 4 (1987) (privacy theories not implicated when individuals request information concerning themselves). Accordingly, if the requestor does not own the access device number at issue, the district must withhold the submitted iFile number under section 552.136 of the Government Code. However, if the requestor is the owner of the access device number at issue, the district must release the responsive information.

This letter ruling is limited to the particular information at issue in this request and limited to the facts as presented to us; therefore, this ruling must not be relied upon as a previous determination regarding any other information or any other circumstances.

This ruling triggers important deadlines regarding the rights and responsibilities of the governmental body and of the requestor.
