Re: Request for any information related to named individual occurring on or after 01/01/08 and information regarding an incident on 08/15/09 involving named individuals; request includes the arrest report, offense report, etc.; ORR #10-11932

Dear Ms. Mares:

The Office of the Attorney General has received your request for a ruling and assigned your request ID# 547319.

After reviewing your arguments and the submitted information, we have determined your request does not present a novel or complex issue. Thus, we are addressing your claims in a memorandum opinion. First, we note you have not submitted information regarding the request for information concerning a specified 2009 offense. To the extent it exists, we assume you have released it. *See* Gov't Code §§ 552.301, .302. You claim the submitted information must be withheld from the requestor. A request to compile an individual's criminal history implicates this person's privacy. We have concluded such a compilation is highly embarrassing information and is generally not of legitimate concern to the public. Therefore, to the extent you maintain law enforcement records depicting the named individual as a suspect, arrestee, or criminal defendant, you must withhold the submitted information under section 552.101 of the Government Code in conjunction with common-law privacy.
