Re: Interpretation of TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN. art 6701d, §81 (c) (Vernon 1994).

Dear Dan,

On behalf of Rep. Burt Solomons and the City of Denton, TX, I am requesting an Attorney General's opinion as to the constitutionality of TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN. art 6701d, §81(c) (Vernon 1994), which states:

A person may not stand in a roadway for the purposes of soliciting a ride, contribution, employment or business from the occupant of any vehicle, except that a person may stand in a roadway to solicit charitable contributions if authorized to do so by the local authority having jurisdiction over the roadway.

Enclosed, is a copy of a letter from the Acting City Attorney of Denton, Mr. Mike Bucek, relating to whether or not solitation of contributions in roadways can be limited by a municipality only to charitable organizations.
