Texas Office of the Attorney General Names Region 1 Child Support Employee Assistant Attorney General of the Year

Jason Bujnosek singled out as region's top attorney for dedication to Texas children

Lubbock – The Office of the Attorney General recognized Jason Bujnosek, an Assistant Attorney General ("AAG") in the Child Support Division's Lubbock office, for his commitment to Texas children. Bujnosek was named Assistant Attorney General of the Year for the Child Support Division's Region 1. He was presented with the award at the 2025 Statewide Assistant Attorneys General Conference.

One Assistant Attorney General was selected for this honor from each of the state's ten child support regions, along with an Assistant Attorney General from the Child Support Division headquarters office in Austin. Honorees are chosen based on recommendations from their peers and supervisors, focusing on employees willing to go beyond their normal duties to serve Texas children. Each recipient demonstrates a desire to serve Texas families, help their colleagues, and enhance the Attorney General's Child Support Division.

Bujnosek, who joined the Office of the Attorney General in 2019, represents the State of Texas in legal actions to establish paternity between children of unmarried parents and their biological fathers. He also works to establish, enforce, and modify court orders that require parents to provide child support, medical support, and dental support.

A graduate of the Texas Tech University School of Law, Bujnosek was chosen to be the region's Assistant Attorney General of the Year for being an exemplary attorney, a willing trainer, and a strong leader. He has demonstrated the willingness to take on any task and provide wise legal direction to his co-workers, earning the reputation as a reliable leader.
