## Texas Office of the Attorney General Names State Office Child Support Employee Assistant Attorney General of the Year

Michele Legg singled out as region's top attorney for dedication to Texas children

**Austin** – The Office of the Attorney General recognized Michele Legg, an Assistant Attorney General ("AAG") in the Child Support Division's headquarters office in Austin, for her commitment to Texas children. Legg was named Assistant Attorney General of the Year for the Child Support Division's state headquarters. She was presented with the award at the 2025 Statewide Assistant Attorneys General Conference.

One AAG was selected for this honor from each of the state's ten child support regions, along with an AAG from the Child Support Division headquarters office in Austin. Honorees are chosen based on recommendations from their peers and supervisors, focusing on employees willing to go beyond their normal duties. Each recipient demonstrates a desire to serve Texas families, help their colleagues, and enhance the Attorney General's Child Support Division.

Legg, who joined the Office of the Attorney General in 2021, represents the State of Texas in legal actions to establish paternity between children of unmarried parents and their biological fathers. She also works to establish, enforce, and modify court orders that require parents to provide child support, medical support, and dental support.

A graduate of the Gonzaga University School of Law, Legg was chosen to be the State Office's Assistant Attorney General of the Year for being an exemplary attorney, a willing trainer, and a strong leader. She has demonstrated the willingness to take on any task and provide wise legal direction to her co-workers, earning the reputation as a reliable leader.

"Michele seeks out opportunities to assist team members across the agency and has a unique ability to quickly build positive relationships with both internal and external customers in any situation. Her bias towards action, encouraging attitude, and desire to solve problems has been invaluable to our division," said Matthew Block, Division Chief of the Child Support Division's Legal Services.
