Texas Office of the Attorney General Names Region 2 Child Support Employee Assistant Attorney General of the Year

Alexandra Rothenberg singled out as region's top attorney for dedication to Texas children

San Antonio – The Office of the Attorney General recognized Alexandra Rothenberg, an Assistant Attorney General ("AAG") in the Child Support Division's San Antonio office, for her commitment to Texas children. Rothenberg was named Assistant Attorney General of the Year for the Child Support Division's Region 2. She was presented with the award at the 2025 Statewide Assistant Attorneys General Conference.

One AAG was selected from each of the state's ten child support regions, along with an AAG from the Child Support Division headquarters office in Austin. Honorees are chosen based on recommendations from their peers and supervisors, focusing on willing to go beyond their normal duties to serve Texas children. Each recipient demonstrates a desire to serve Texas families, help their colleagues, and enhance the Attorney General's Child Support Division.

Rothenberg, who joined the Office of the Attorney General in 2023, represents the State of Texas in legal actions to establish paternity between children of unmarried parents and their biological fathers. She also works to establish, enforce, and modify court orders that require parents to provide child support, medical support, and dental support.

A graduate of the University of Chicago Kent School of Law, Rothenberg was chosen to be the region's Assistant Attorney General of the Year for being an exemplary attorney, a willing trainer, and a strong leader. She has demonstrated the willingness to take on any task and provide wise legal direction to her co-workers, earning the reputation as a reliable leader.
