

Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) Training

Friday, May 29th, 2009 1pm-3pm

SafePlace and the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) invite you to attend the Address Confidentiality Program training. There will be a two-hour training session.

With increased public access to personal information, there is a rising need for address confidentiality for victims of family violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Fearing for their safety, many victims do not obtain a driver's license or register to vote. The Office of the Attorney General administers the Address Confidentiality Program by providing a substitute post office box address and free mail forwarding service for participants.

The training will consist of an overview of how the Program works and teaches victim advocates how to properly fill out the ACP application. All victim advocates must be trained on ACP before they can utilize the program. It is a safety tool and one step to an overall safety plan. It is neither a witness protection program nor a guarantee of safety.
